Position Announcement (Two Positions Available)

Two tenure-track positions at the Assistant or Associate Professor level. Responsibilities include teaching courses in school psychology and department undergraduate courses, advising graduate students, research, and university service. Teaching load is typically nine hours per semester. Salary and rank will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Required: The positions require a doctorate in school psychology or related field. ABDs will be considered if there is strong evidence of completion by August 2011. Demonstrated potential for effective teaching and scholarship and pre-employment background checks are also required.

Preferred: Two years or more of practice as a school psychologist and school psychology degree from NASP or APA approved program.

Department of Educational Psychology and Foundations: The department includes 16 full-time faculty members in the areas of Human Development, Educational Psychology, School Psychology, Research and Assessment, and Social Foundations. The department provides coursework to support the teacher education program as well as master's, specialist, and doctoral graduate programs. The department has master's programs in educational psychology, professional development for teachers, and a [NASP approved specialist program](http://www.uni.edu/coe/epf) in school psychology.
