Ph.D. degree in area(s) of expertise, or equivalent as noted below. Also required are the ability to teach successfully, interest in productive scholarship or creative achievement, and ability to cooperate with others for the good of the institution.

For Instructor designation:

A Master's degree in area(s) of expertise, and/or active progress toward a Doctorate, or equivalent as noted below. Also required are the ability to teach successfully, interest in productive scholarship or creative achievement, and ability to cooperate with others for the good of the institution.

OTHER QUALIFICATIONS

Instructor: M.A. in History and teaching experience and/or active progress toward a Doctorate, or equivalent and teaching experience are required; concentration in American History is preferred.

Assistant Professor: Ph.D. or equivalent in History and teaching experience required; doctoral concentration in American History preferred.

Preference will be given to applicants with college level teaching experience. A record of research/publication and experience with use of instructional technology and student-centered pedagogy are preferred. Experience working with diverse populations is preferred.
